

YouTube Video Upload Guide


Step 1. Your YouTube Channel

You will need to create a YouTube Channel (if you don't already have one) to be able to upload videos. You can use a new or existing Google/Gmail account to do this.

Step 2. Uploading Your Video

If you are uploading your ReelLIFE SCIENCE video from your computer, sign in to YouTube Studio http://studio.youtube.com/ and in the top-right hand corner, click 'CREATE' and then 'Upload videos' to select your video file. Most common file formats (.mov, .mp4, .wmv, .flv, .avi) are supported.


Step 3. Adding Details

Add important details like a Title and Description to your ReelLIFE SCIENCE video. You can do this while it is uploading. If you use a catchy title for your video – e.g. something you might search for on YouTube – you are likely to get more views for your video, than with a generic video name.

You can choose one of the thumbnail images automatically generated as the main image of your video, or you can upload a different image if you prefer. The best size for thumbnail images is 1280x720 pixels.

You can choose to add your video to a new or existing playlist on your channel, to help viewers find similar videos you may have already uploaded.






We recommend that you select 'Yes it's made for kids' under Audience, to automatically disable features like comments, notifications etc.

Step 4. Visibility/Privacy

Under 'Visibility' make sure to select 'Public' under 'Save or Publish' to make sure the ReelLIFE SCIENCE judges and your intended audience can view your video. If your video is private it cannot be viewed by our judges!



Copy the video link underneath the video image and use this in your ReelLIFE SCIENCE application.

After the ReelLIFE SCIENCE competition has ended, you can leave the video privacy settings as 'Public' or you can choose to make the video 'Unlisted' or 'Private' if you prefer, or you can remove it from YouTube entirely.
